Are you a senior and need help paying for Groceries?

If you are aged 60+, a resident of Lackawanna County, have monthly income below \$1,916 for single individuals and \$2,586 for married couples, and resources under \$9,000, excluding your home, primary vehicle and other items, you could qualify for SNAP, **S**upplemental **N**utrition **A**ssistance **P**rogram. Approximately 2 out of 3 seniors who qualify to receive SNAP are missing out on benefits. Don't be one of them.
