
#### **About the Series:**

### Hickory Project – NEPA's Top Bluegrass Band Sunday, October 26, 2014 • 4:00 pm

What began as a routine experiment has turned into a revolutionary project, henceforth known as **Hickory** 



Project. Formed in 2001, the band features hard-driving traditional and original acoustic music deeply rooted in bluegrass. Hickory Project is a powerhouse of musical

prowess with the expert licks of National Mandolin Champion Anthony Hannigan, banjo phenomenon Mike Beaky, Steve Belcher, Josh Segulia, and Jillian Hannigan. Hickory Project is globally acclaimed. They have captivated audiences throughout Europe and the US, and even as far away as Australia. Hickory Project has now produced one DVD and seven CDs under their own label, Hickory Productions. Whether it is straight-forward traditional or a flare for the new realm in acoustic music, Hickory Project is a tour-de-force.

### Hoffenberg-Laubach Piano-Organ Duo Plus The Marywood Chamber Singers Sunday, March 29, 2015 • 4:00 pm

The first half of this program will include piano-organ duets performed by two virtuosos on their instruments –



Rick Hoffenberg on piano and Mark Laubach on organ. The second half will feature the Marywood University Chamber Singers, a select group of vocalists from Marywood University. The ensemble is

directed by Dr. Hoffenberg, an Associate Professor at Marywood University, where he serves as Director of Choral Activities and Coordinator of Vocal and Keyboard Studies. Dr. Hoffenberg has spent the past 15 summers at Chautauqua Opera, where he is a pianist, coach, and assistant conductor on the music staff. The Marywood University Chamber Singers are a select ensemble of

undergraduates from Marywood University. The group's repertoire encompasses accompanied and a cappella repertoire ranging from masterworks of the Renaissance through world premieres by living composers, as well as vocal jazz. Since January 1986 Mark Laubach has served as Organist and Choirmaster of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Wilkes-Barre, where he administers an active liturgical and choral music program, concert series, and Music from St. Stephen's, a radio broadcast heard weekly on WVIA-FM Public Radio. Since winning first prize in the 1984 American Guild of Organists (AGO) National Competition, Mark has performed in many of the most prominent churches and concert halls in the USA, and in Great Britain and Germany. Canon Laubach teaches organ students privately and at Marywood University in Scranton.

### Duo Montagnard (Joseph Murphy, Saxophone & Matthew Slotkin, Guitar) Sunday, April 19, 2015 • 4:00 pm

**Duo Montagnard** was formed in 2002 and has performed over 250 concerts in more than 45 states and 14 countries. The duo is committed to the creation of a new



repertoire for this unusual grouping of instruments. Duo Montagnard has released four recordings, which include commissioned compositions, new music for saxophone and guitar, and transcriptions of music by Robert Beaser, Astor

Piazzolla and Ralph Towner. **Dr. Slotkin** is an Assistant Professor of Music at Bloomsburg University, where he directs the guitar program. **Dr. Murphy** has been the saxophone professor at Mansfield University of Pennsylvania since 1987, where he has also served as Department Chair and Director of Bands.
