On Friday, May 20th, 2016 at 7pm, The Excelsior Cornet Band, the only authentic Civil War brass band in New York State, will present a program entitled "Two Centuries of American Patriotic Music" in the sanctuary. This very special program will showcase popular American patriotic music, beginning with the Revolutionary era, continuing through the War of 1812 and the Civil War, to songs from World War One and Two. Each song is introduced with a narrative that tells its unique story. Included in the program are such classics as *Yankee Doodle*, *The Star Spangled Banner*, *Battle Hymn of the Republic*, *Over There*, *America the Beautiful*, *God Bless America*, and *The Stars and Stripes Forever*. This is the final event in the 2015-16 Arts at First Presbyterian concert series.



Founded in 2001, the Excelsior Cornet Band performs on original Civil War era band instruments, dating from as early as the 1820's up to the 1870's. The musicians of the Excelsior Cornet Band are professional performers with many years of experience in a wide variety of musical genres.

Minute for Mission: Mother's Day

In a small village in Africa, a middle-aged woman named Linley dreamed of becoming a small-business owner. However, famine and lack of access to capital made it difficult for Linley to achieve her dream.

In January 2014, Linley attended a local program sponsored by a Presbyterian World Mission partner, the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian, and learned about a project funded by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to help rural women save money and obtain loans.

The village's savings and loan group was established, and Linley was one of its founding members. After three months, the group had accumulated enough money that members were able to start borrowing for their small businesses. Linley received a loan equal to about \$76 to start a business selling produce, such as potatoes and vegetables.

Her business grew, and today Linley has installed a solar panel on her house, bought livestock, and secured a four-acre plot where she does irrigation farming. She uses her solar power to generate income by charging

people's mobile phone batteries for a small fee. The irrigation farming has allowed her to have food year-round, and the surplus is sold to help pay for her children's school fees.

Your gifts to Healthy Women Healthy Families support projects like the one that created the village's savings and loan group. Without donors' support, Linley wouldn't have been able to obtain a loan to start her own small business.

Spark (Newborn - 3 year old) enjoy Bible stories, songs and games in the nursery. Stories this month are the Philip and the Ethiopian, Saul to Paul, an Angel frees Peter, and Paul's Letters.

Power Xpress (4 year old - Grade 5) participate in one combined classroom and experience Bible stories through interactive classes. In April we will learn about the spread of the early church through Peter and Cornelius and the Fruit of the Spirit.

We Believe: With All Boldness and Freedom (Grades 6-8) Room 209. Students will finish their studies on the New Testament, having gained a picture of the life of Jesus and the early church. This month we will continue reading the Epistles as the church grows.

PresbyYouth (Grades 9-12 and college-age adults) are encouraged to either join an adult class or participate in the middle school class.

Beginning on May 11, he will collaborate with **Dr. Jay Clymer** for a three-week class on “**The Gift of Water.**” Through an interplay of scripture and science, we will consider the great “circulatory system” of our planet—and what we might do to honor this extraordinary gift.

Cost is about \$40.00 for the shuttle. Rentals are available. Contact Dick or Marie Cochrane at 570-587-3970 for more details.



A heartfelt felt heart

On Mother's Day, express your love for your mom or another special woman by giving her this gift from the heart.




What you need:

- Red felt (8" x 11" sheet)
- Dark pen
- Fabric scissors
- Pillow stuffing
- Straight pins
- Embroidery thread (pink, red or black)
- Needle
- An adult to help

What you do:

1. Fold the felt in half and draw a heart on it. Cut out the heart so you have two of the same size.
2. Place the hearts on top of each other, add stuffing and pin the hearts together.
3. Thread the needle with a long piece of thread. Knot the end.
4. Sew the hearts together. Knot the thread and trim the ends. Remove pins.
5. Give the gift – and a hug!





I wish to thank all of you for your devotion to our church and its needs.


