## From the Pastor

### June 2016



It is my annual Memorial Day ritual to pull the Adirondack chair out of the shed and scrub it down. That is the signal that it is time to put together my summer reading list. I'm looking forward to diving into a fresh set of pages. Let me tell you what is on this year's list.

At the top of the list is *Searching for Sunday* by Rachel Held Evans. She is a brilliant new author who speaks for a generation that has little time for organized religion. Rachel writes compellingly of her spiritual longing – and the church's steadfast refusal to change, adapt, or welcome young adults. Her new book is described as "a spiritual travel guide for religious runaways," and I am certain she will teach me a lot of things that I need to know.

As I mentioned in a recent sermon, the next Amazon box on my porch will include a copy of Peter Enns' new book, *The Sin of Certainty: Why God Desires Our Trust More Than Our "Correct" Beliefs*. So many of us have been told to avoid questioning God or God's ways. The truth about the Bible, however, is that it reveals a God who is always beyond our understanding, always beyond our descriptions, always beyond the illusions of human control. Dr. Enns writes as a fugitive from fundamentalism . . . and writes exceedingly well. Can't wait until the Big Brown Truck delivers that book!

Sometime back, I picked up a copy of *Service Is the Point: Members as Ministers to the World*, and now is a good time to read it. Gus Nelson, retired presbytery executive and full-time gadfly, has turned a long-established view of the church on its head. "We don't exist for ourselves," says Dr. Nelson, "we exist to empower our members to make a constructive difference in the world." You can expect me to draw on this book as we prepare for our major day of community outreach on September 25.

A few books are beckoning from the depths of the Spirit. I have never read much of Thomas Merton's writings, so his *Essential Writings* will provide a decent survey of his work, and suggest some jumping-off places for future exploration. Also, Margaret Guenther's *Holy Listening: The Art of Spiritual Direction* is the seminal book about a skill that I wish to deepen for my pastoral work.

Some of you know that my second week of study will take place in June, when I will visit the Brubeck archives in Stockton, California. I am researching Brubeck's choral music, most of which is built upon musical settings of the Bible. To prepare for this, I'm re-reading *It's About Time: The Dave Brubeck Story* by Fred Hall, and digging into Doug Ramsey's massive biography of Brubeck's saxophonist, *Take Five: The Public and Private Lives of Paul Desmond*.

And for fun? Well, I am open to your suggestions for a good rock-'em, sock-'em mystery novelist, like Dick Francis, but without horses. Have a writer that you would suggest?
