By "them" we mean the 1,250,000 young men and women on the college and university campuses of the nation striving to obtain an education.

The \$10,000,000 Sesquicentennial Fund for Christian Education was begun in 1936 to undergird these Presbyterian institutions—to help make them more effective in the vital work at hand.
