About this morning's music: Today's focus is on Christ as the light of the world, but our special music also highlights that tomorrow our nation remembers the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr.

At the first service we hear a not-so-familiar spiritual, "My Way's Cloudy." Perhaps even more important than the message of the song is the story of its arranger, H. T. Burleigh. Born in 1866 in Erie, his mother was a domestic worker. Despite her college education and fluency in French and Greek, she was unable to gain a teaching job because of her race. Burleigh received a conservatory sponsorship, but had to work at cleaning the school halls. Singing the spirituals learned from his grandfather, he caught the attention of the composer Dvorak, who wrote down the songs and incorporated them into his "New World Symphony.

The anthem at the second service is the simple traditional tune, "Down to the River to Pray." Returned to popular consciousness by the movie "O Brother, Where Art Thou," the song's origins are also "cloudy." It may have originated as a white Appalachian hymn, but also perhaps as a slave song.
