Lent is coming

A season of forty days before Easter, Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 22**. All are invited to a simple worship service that evening at 7:00 p.m. Many of our worship services will focus on the rich stories of the Gospel of John.

After Ash Wednesday, we begin **an adult education series on "Exclusion and Embrace."** Each Wednesday evening at 6:00 p.m., the class will discuss a brief video that explores our relationship to those who have frequently been excluded from our circle of faith. These include gays and lesbians, the Jews, those who practice other religions, and people of other nations. Some of these videos are already posted online, so we will share those links in our weekly emails.
