Next distribution is December 12, 4-6 p.m.

Our deacons are sponsoring a Grief Support group for the community. It will meet at the Gathering Place, 304 S. State Street, Clarks Summit on the third Thursday of each month, the next one being November 21 at 6 p.m. It is open to all.

Look for our Holiday Pajama tree next Sunday. Select a tag from the tree in the Narthex. Purchase a pair of PJs for that child, returning it by **December 10** either wrapped or in a gift bag **along with the tag from the tree.** Please do not include anything extra. The gifts need to be the same as children will be opening them together at the Head Start Center.
