Following worship today, Christian Ed is sponsoring a special study during coffee hour about the "Barmen Declaration," a confession the Presbyterian church confirms in its Book of Confessions. After Adolf Hitler gained political control of the Evangelical Church of Germany in 1933, his appointees pressed his agenda, prohibiting the use of the Old Testament and requiring that clergy be of Aryan descent. The "Confessing Church" formed in resistance, and its leaders, insisting the church must remain faithful to Jesus Christ, issued the Barmen Declaration in 1934.

This study is meant to get us thinking and talking about how the church might respond to political pressures and speak with a clear and faithful voice in times when such pressures arise. If you're interested, grab your refreshments and head down the hall to the former Youth Room (room 111) for a time of learning and discussion.


Here are some facts about organ donation.

- 1. Every donor can save up to 8 lives and enhance over 75 more.
- 2. Another person is added to the national transplant waiting list every 10 minutes.
- 3. 17 people die each day waiting for an organ transplant.
- 4. 90% of Americans support organ donation, yet only 60% are signed up as donors.
- 5. Everyone can sign up as an organ donor no matter what their health status. Register at donors1.org.
