November Food Drive

The Deacons are sponsoring a November Food Drive to serve the Dalton Food Pantry and The Gathering Place. During the season of Thanksgiving, please help feed those in need within our community. Donations will be accepted throughout November. Any non-perishable items are appreciated, such as cereal, oatmeal, pasta, sauce, peanut butter, tuna, crackers, etc.

On November 16 we will observe National Donor Sabbath.

As you enter the Narthex, you will see a "Threads of Love" Donor Memorial Quilt. You are invited to take some time with the quilt, noting those organ donors memorialized by this quilt.

Each year, National Donor Sabbath is observed two weekends before Thanksgiving Day. The concept behind this day is to unite different people of different religions, while learning how to save a life by donating vital organs to those in need. Time is taken to talk about the importance and public need of saving lives through organ and tissue donation. Today's speaker is Kathy Rowinski, Hospital Services Coordinator, Gift of Life.

Organ donation transfers life to others so that the recipient has the chance of a full, long life, free of diseased organs such as kidneys, hearts, and even eyes. These organs are

donated by the families of loved ones who pass away in accidents or other health issues with their organs intact, thus giving people with organ problems a second chance at life. Everyone can sign up as an organ donor no matter what their health status. Register at **donors1.org.**
