Introduction to the Sermon on the Mount

Responsive Reading of Gospel Lesson: Matthew 5:1-12

Leader: When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down,
his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

Blessed are the poor in spirit,

People: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Leader: Blessed are those who mourn,

People: for they will be comforted.

Leader: Blessed are the meek,

People: for they will inherit the earth.

Leader: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

People: for they will be filled.

Leader: Blessed are the merciful,

People: for they will receive mercy.

Leader: Blessed are the pure in heart,

People: for they will see God.

Leader: Blessed are the peacemakers,

People: for they will be called children of God.

Leader: Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake,

People: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Leader: Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.

People: Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 6:1-15

**Don’t show off your giving, the good you are doing, but quietly give without public display.
Let prayer be in secret, your spirit renewing. Don’t heap empty phrases, but pray then this way:
“Our Father in heaven, may your name be holy. We pray for your kingdom and our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we, too, pardon freely. Protect us from troubles and evils we dread.”**

so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father
who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you...**

**People: But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor
rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal.**

Instead seek God’s kingdom—its worth never lessens
And find your heart’s treasure in things that endure.**
