HELP US CELEBRATE THE LEGACY OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

This winter, we are joining The Voluntary Action Center (VAC) in creating "Care Bags" to be donated to KRMA Shelter (formerly Bethel AME Shelter), the Community Intervention Center, St Anthony's Haven and the Catherine McAuley Center. Last year 500 Care Bags were assembled and distributed to the homeless shelters through a combined community effort in the spirit of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.. First Presbyterian Church of Clarks Summit, through the Mission and Justice Committee, helped assemble the Care Bags with Fourth grade students at the South Abington School.

This Martin Luther King, Jr. Day 2015, VAC is again asking schools, businesses and community service organizations to donate one item to place in the Care Bag. However, based on the success of last year, VAC's goal is to collect 600 of each item by January 12, 2015. These items will be organized and distributed on Monday, January 19, 2015 in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. The Mission and Justice Committee has decided to collect and donate 600 travel sized (1-2 ounce) hand sanitizers to this worthy venture. Most grocery and drug stores sell these sanitizers for a dollar or less.

If you would like to help reach our goal of 600, please place the travel sized hand sanitizers in the orange basket located in the Narthex. Collection runs through January 11, 2015. Thank you in advance for your support.



From the Pastor

Every once in a while, something big happens somewhere in the world, and the God Squad goes there to mark it as a miracle site. A statue of the Virgin weeps. A crippled woman drops her crutches and stands up healed. A burned-out hippy told me one time that Sedona, Arizona is the stairway to heaven.

Yet the Gospel of John announces any place can be that stairway. The news after Christmas is that the Eternal Word of the Father comes down from heaven and lives among normal people. Holiness happens among the ordinary. In one intriguing story in the Gospel of John (1:43-51), Jesus awakens faith by spotting a guy under a fig tree. No big deal -- except for Nathanael, the one who was spotted.

But this is how God's dominion grows. Ordinary people have holy moments, and invite their friends to come and see. Nathanael first approached Jesus because Philip invited him. Philip had discovered something about Jesus that prompted him to invite Nathanael to discover it for himself. It begins a chain reaction among friends. One friend saw it, spoke to another. The second friend saw it in a different way, and undoubtedly spoke to somebody else. The Kingdom of God grows friend by friend in an invitation to the kind of holiness that comes in the middle of the everyday.

This is the curious work of the Spirit. As Eugene Peterson writes,

The hardest thing is to believe that God's work – this dazzling creation, this astonishing salvation, this cascade of blessings – is all being worked out in and under the conditions of our humanity: at picnics and around dinner tables, in conversations and while walking along roads, in puzzled questions and homely stories... Everything Jesus does and says takes place within the limits and conditions of our humanity. No fireworks. No special effects. Yes, there are miracles, plenty of them. But because they are so much a part of the fabric of everyday life, very few notice. The miraculousness of the miracle is obscured by the ordinariness of the people involved. (*Christ Plays in Ten Thousand Places*, p. 34)

We must never underestimate the impact we can have on others, simply by sharing where we have seen God at work in daily life. It is not difficult, nor does it have to be pushy or obnoxious. The writer Madeline L'Engle said it best: "We do not draw people to Christ by loudly discrediting what they believe, by telling them how wrong they are and how right we are, but by showing them a light that is so lovely that they want with all their hearts to know the source of it." (Walking on Water, p. 122)

Do you want the Kingdom to grow? Do you want God's influence, power, and grace to increase? Watch for the Light of Christ breaking in. Tell your friends where you see it. This is the invitation to offer: come and see.

And I make you a deal: if you invite your friends to join you for worship, we will do all we can to show them the light and life of Jesus Christ.

SAVE THE DATE! - Saturday, February 28, Dr. Beth Tanner will lead us in a study of the Psalms as part of our Jansen Lectureship.

Spark (Newborn - 3 year old) enjoy Bible stories, songs and games in the nursery with teachers Myrna Diven and our Sunday caregivers. In January, our Spark students will hear about Simeon and Anna (Luke 2:22-40), Jesus, the boy, at the Temple (Luke 2:41-52), John the Baptist (Luke 3:1-18) and Jesus going to Nazareth (Luke 4:14-30).


Power Xpress (4 year old - Grade 5) For the months of January and February, children will experience Bible stories in one classroom. January 7 and 14: The Boy's Lunch (John 6:1-14). Jesus used a boy's simple gift of two fish and five loaves of bread and turned it into a feast for more than five thousand people. January 21 and 28: The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). Through the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus teaches us to love God and other people.

We Believe: The Story of God's Faithfulness (Grades 6-8) Room 209 with Jana Schillinger and Dave Porter. Using We Believe: The Story of God's Faithfulness, our Middle School Class will spend the year digging deeper into the Old Testament, learning and experiencing how God revealed himself to the Hebrew people. In January, students learn about Ruth's story (Book of Ruth), the judges of Israel (Judges 4:1-24; 6; 7:1-24; 14; 15:1-20) and Samuel and Israel's first king (1 Samuel 3:1-18; 9:1-22; 9:27-10:16).

PresbyYouth (**Grades 9-12; college age adults**) Room 111 with Jack Pittman and Darlene Scappatura. PresbyYouth's Nativity, Water and Wilderness unit encourages students to observe "rites of passage" events in the life of Jesus and to make connections with faith milestones in their own lives. The journey begins by discovering the significance of water in the Bible (Genesis 1:1-23; Isaiah 43:1-2; Revelation 22:1-5, 17), recalling Jesus baptism and our baptisms (Mathew 3; 28:16-20; Romans 6; Galatians 3), learning how we can hear and obey God's call (1 Samuel 3:1-21; Jeremiah 1:4-19; Mark 1:16-20; Acts 9:1-22) and exploring important moments of faith development in our lives (Luke 2:21-38; Mark 14-15).

Talking About God Stuff (T.A.G.S.) Room 206. January 7-28: *The Truth About David*. David is a towering figure in the Jewish scriptures. The greatest of Israel's kings, he is a complex person of extraordinary power and deep vulnerability. We will explore four different perspectives that the Bible has on David: the hero, the sinner, the political symbol, the hope for the future. Rev. Carter and friends will study some of the most important texts about King David -- and we may discover something about ourselves along the way.

Faith and Life Room 210. January 7-21: *Faith and Science*: There is no doubt that faith and science continually intersect with each other. Science focuses on acquired data while faith focuses on the creator of that data and often the different focus seems to create tension between the two. So is there a way for faith and science exist together peaceably? Throughout January, Meg Hatch and Jay Clymer will help us explore intersections of faith such as creation and evolution and discover how the two are compatible.







Ephesians 4:4-6 talks a lot about *one*. Create one painting that says it all.




What you need:
