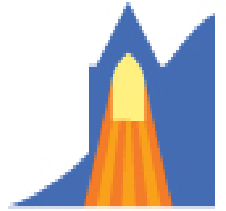

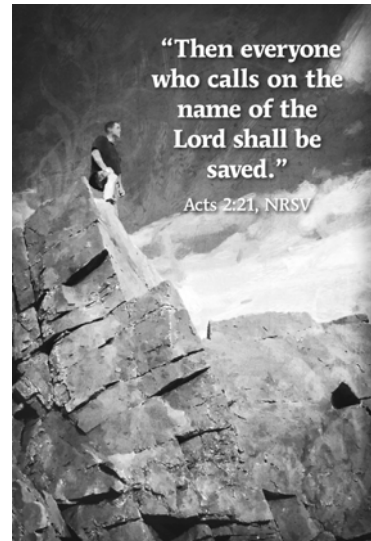

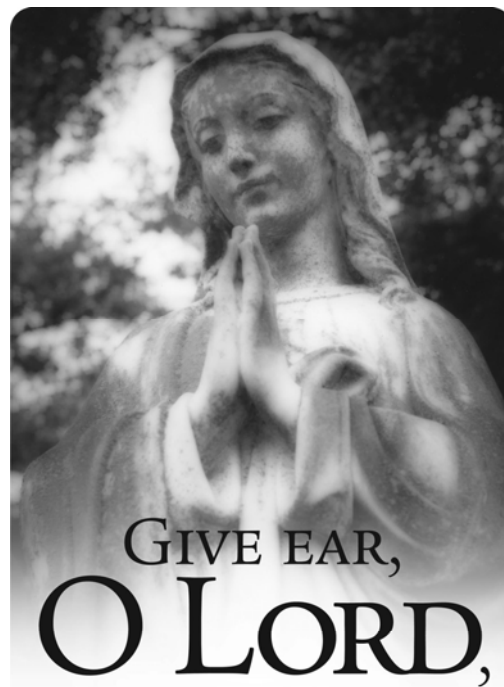

From the Pastor

Dear Friends—

As summer draws near, I have been making a lot of lists: *30 Home Repairs That We Need to Do*, *15 Books That I'd Like to Read*, *19 Grilling Recipes to Attempt for the Family*, and so on. A friend recently pointed out he maintains two lists: what he hopes to do and what he has already done. At times he says the first list can be demanding and oppressive, but the second list gives him relief and assures him of his own slow progress.

What kind of lists will you keep this summer? Let me suggest, among them, that you create a list for your observations on the ways of God's world. Not merely what you need to do, but what you notice!

For instance, in the Book of Proverbs, sometimes we come across the occasional list:

Three things are too wonderful for me; four I do not understand: the way of an eagle in the sky, the way of a snake on a rock, the way of a ship on the high seas, and the way of a man with a girl. (30:18-19).

Three things are stately in their stride; four are stately in their gait: the lion, which is the mightiest among wild animals and does not turn back before any; the strutting rooster, the he-goat, and a king striding before his people (30:29-31).

Wisdom comes from paying attention and reflecting on what we see. So here's my near-summer invitation to make a Wisdom List. Write down some of your life's observations and polish them in your heart. This is one way to become wise.

Here is one of the lists that I have come across in my reading. It's from William Sloane Coffin, one-time Yale chaplain and pastor of Riverside Church. He calls it "Things to Be Well Aware Of" and it comes from his book Credo:

- A dog can't go anywhere if he's always stopping to scratch his fleas.
- Not all roads lead to the peak of the same mountain; some lead over the precipice.
- God's forgiveness is more than a blessing; it's a challenge.
- Things not worth doing are not worth doing well.
- To let a point pass that calls for a challenge is to be politely dishonest.
- The simplest act of human kindness for a fellow human being is more important than any refinement of the mind.
- Fear is the enemy of learning; it gives ignorance its power.
- God loves us as we are, but much too much to leave us there.
- There never was a night or problem that could defeat sunrise or hope.

Here's to an observant summer, ever increasing in wisdom and full of spiritual growth!

2014 Pentecost Offering

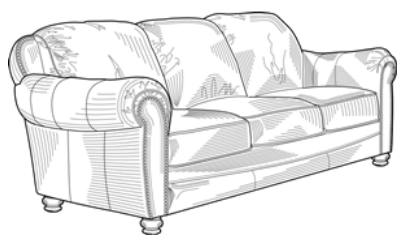


Pentecost offering

The Pentecost Offering is one of four special offerings of the Presbyterian Church. Dedicated on Pentecost (June 8 this year), the focus of this offering is to encourage, develop, and support young people and support the needs of at-risk children. A large portion (40%) of this offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. This year the Mission and Justice Committee have chosen the Northeast Suicide Prevention Initiative (NSPI) as the recipient of our portion of the Pentecost Offering. Begun in 2011, NSPI is made up of all volunteers from local agencies and survivors who have lost someone to suicide, all working toward suicide prevention in Lackawanna and surrounding counties. They meet monthly to coordinate formal clinical and community suicide prevention trainings and survivor activities. 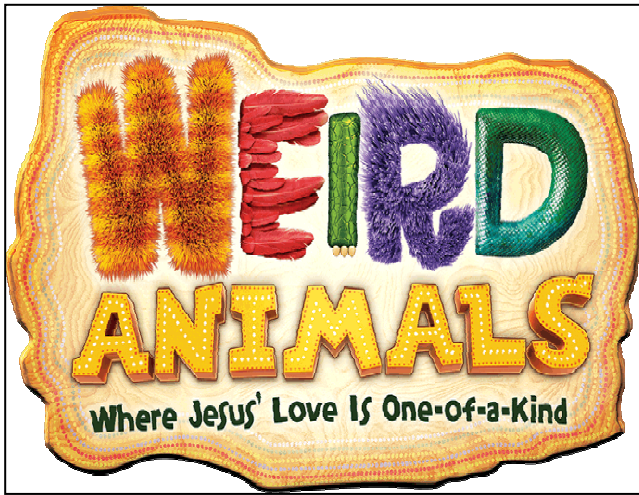

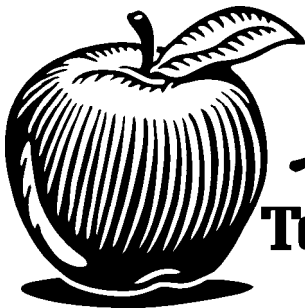
Robert London Scholarship Fund

WE CAN ALL RECYCLE

As part of our Green Church initiative, the Earth Care Task Force asks you to please recycle at church as well as at home. There are recycle bins in the kitchen where you may place clean, recyclable items. From the Clarks Summit Borough website: **ALL PLASTICS WITH A RECYCLING SYMBOL #1-7, ALMOST ANY PAPER PRODUCT, INCLUDING JUNK MAIL, MAGAZINES, OFFICE-GRADE PAPER, NEWSPAPERS, CORRUGATED CARDBOARD AND FOOD BOXES CAN BE RECYCLED TOGETHER!**



CFL's (the new curly queue bulb) must be recycled. Now that most incandescent bulbs have been replaced by Compact Fluorescent Lights, how do you dispose of them when they burn out? CFL's should never go in the garbage and must be recycled. We encourage you to bring (**only**) CFL's from home and dispose of them in the gray barrel next to the stove in the kitchen. Please be careful to not break the CFL's.

HAITI

Please find below two links to the YouTube videos that are samples of some of the work our delegation of videographers Justin Kraky and Cassidy Evans, photographer and Presbyterian Pat Henneforth, and student and Presbyterian Stacey Trunk, and I had done during our trip to Haiti from May 19 to June 1. Along with my artwork and design as exhibited in these two videos, we will be combining all manner of video footage, interviews, journals, reflections, and digital media production efforts to express as best we can the band "2 Rasin's" [Two Roots in English] social justice music, its members' lives, their communities, and their advocacies. Much of what we do will cross over into the initiatives and sustained efforts we at First Presbyterian Church have made to support those we are close to in Haiti including the NaSonje Foundation and Partnerships for Local Development through Groundswell International's Women's Micro-Finance Organizations, Augustin Mona's people of Mozayik who continue to be Internally displaced, these four years since the earthquake, due to two violent expulsions of them from two different settlements, and possibly Pastor Mathieu Ciceron's Rays of Hope School in Solino, Port-au-Prince.

Stephen Ministry is a lay caring ministry being used by thousands of congregations to increase care and outreach to hurting people.

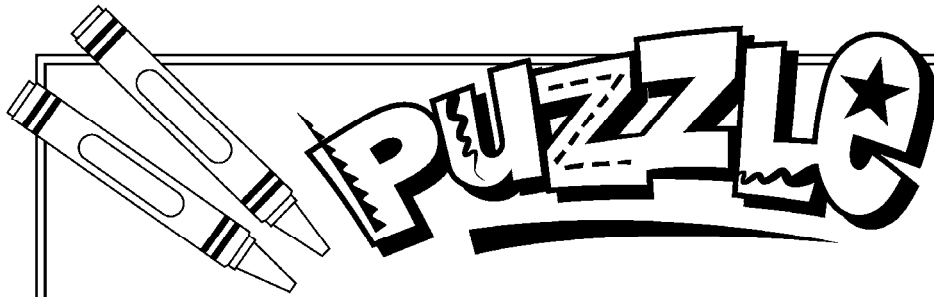

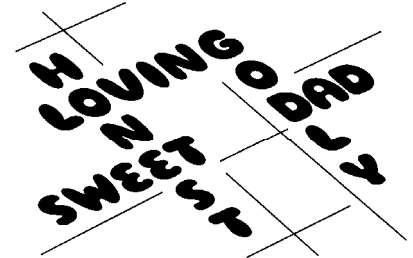

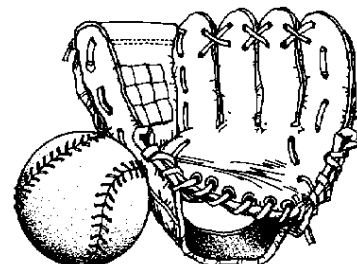
