


Please continue to wear masks for now. However:

A New Service Opportunity

FPCCS is Joining the Hickory Street Community Meals Program

"Enslaving poverty in a world of abundance is an intolerable violation of God's good creation."—Book of Confessions, 9.46

The Mission and Justice Committee is pleased to announce two new opportunities for volunteer service. On the Saturday mornings of August 28th and September 25th, our church will be preparing and serving a large community meal and filling/distributing bags of food at Hickory Street Presbyterian Church. Since Hickory Street began this ministry to combat hunger in the local community, they have seen demand for the meals increase seven-fold and requests for food bags increase almost four-fold. Jack and Diane Scheuer, joined by Charlie and Robin Pinches, assisted at Hickory Street's May 22nd lunch, and reported serving over 100 meals while enjoying great fellowship with our neighbors.

August may seem far-off at this point, but there is much to do in terms of organizing to prepare and serve around 130 meals and distribute around 40 bags of food on each of these days. We need to locate volunteers for a variety of tasks from start to finish.

We anticipate having a shopping list and recipe for around 10 volunteers who could prepare in their own homes, in advance, the main entrée. This could be nice family activity.

We also anticipate needing around 10 volunteers who could prepare in their own homes, in advance, a suggested (i.e., easy to serve) dessert. Another nice family activity.

On the day of the luncheon, we would then need about 12 volunteers to come to Hickory Street to do additional on-site food prep, cooking, plating meals, filling food bags, delivering to both dine-in and drive-up guests, and clean-up.

Opportunities to help "behind-the-scenes" could also include shopping, food collection, food contributions, and of course, financial support.

If you would like to offer your assistance with any of these needs, or would just like additional information, please contact Alan Baker at abaker2@verizon.net or speak to other members of the planning committee (Jack and Diane Scheuer, Melba Fialko, and Ginny O'Brien). Look, too, for sign-up and information sheets to be posted in the church foyer.

The work on September 25th will be part of our larger annual "Worship through Service" weekend.




We will be offering a confirmation class this year for any student in grades 7-12 who is ready to dig deeper in their faith and learn what it means to belong to the church.


