



From the Pastor

# From the Pastor Summer 2022



This year, the Rev. Emily Chudy, a sharp young minister from Malvern, reported on Christian education. Listen to what she said:

Overall, Christian formation looks different in most communities than it did twenty years ago. On Sunday morning, we fight against not only other activities, but we're actually up against a cultural shift that is changing community. Because parents are the number-one influence, equipping parents to be followers of Christ at home has more impact than anything that any of our churches can offer. This requires new tools, new ways of thinking, and new ways of teaching.

Her observations echo the reading that I've done over the past few months. Many of the old, familiar ways for learning the faith have evaporated. All across the land, Sunday schools have shrunk or disappeared. Mission trips have been on hold, and youth group sleepovers have gone away.

We could blame the pandemic, I suppose, but covid-19 has only accelerated cultural changes that were already underway. John Roberto, the Roman Catholic church educator, reminds us that Sunday school operated on a model only a hundred years old – in a 2000-year Christian tradition. Youth groups "worked" when teens were free on Sunday afternoons.

The family has always been the primary arena for learning the faith. How many of us learned to pray, not in a church pew, but at the dinner table or before bedtime? When we were little, who read the Bible stories to us and taught us to memorize the Psalms? Do families ever engage in service projects together? I fear that many households have handed off the educating of young hearts to those outside their homes.

So guess what: as we move forward, we need to find ways to support our households in teaching the faith. The task is really up to all of us. The Bible was not written to experts, but to everyday folks who worked hard to read and understand it.

We want to hear from you: how can we support you and your house in learning and practicing the Christian faith? That's a primary reason why we exist!
