From the Pastor

Summer 2023

Even as a veteran of summer conferences, I wasn't ready for this prayer:

O God, in the course of this busy life, give us times of refreshment and peace; and grant that we may so use our leisure to rebuild our bodies and renew our minds, that our spirits may be opened to the goodness of your creation. Amen.



Perhaps I should have expected the Episcopalian priest who led us in the prayer to offer it from his church family's Book of Common Prayer. Perhaps I could presume the prayer would speak what I find hard to vocalize. This time, it struck a deep chord in my soul. Maybe it resonates with you.

Summer has returned, and our church flock is already scattering for hills, beaches, resorts, campgrounds, and cabins. We have a peripatetic congregation. Any fears of traveling during a pandemic have largely been relieved. Airports are full. Highways are more congested. Everywhere the leisure industry has raised its prices.

But is anybody returning refreshed?

Many of my "vacations" have been breathless. I tend to run from one location to another, speeding by beautiful vistas as I hoof it to the next destination. The camera on my cell phone takes great photos, and quickly. I can shoot four or five pictures in under thirty seconds. Surely one of them will provide a future reminder that I passed through a notable spot without inhabiting it. I confess I return from some vacations needing a vacation. How about you?

The Episcopalian prayer provided a necessary pause. What do we need? "Refreshment and peace." How do we attain such gifts? "Using our leisure" – that is, being a good steward of times that must be planned without being stuffed full. And what must be refreshed? The prayer names the necessary trinity: bodies, minds, spirits, all kept in creative balance.

Leisure may now be a big business, especially among the affluent, but refreshment and peace remain elusive for too many of us. I've chased after refreshment and peace so many times that I've slowly discovered a few tips for cultivating these gifts. Pause, don't hurry. Savor, don't consume. Subtract, don't add. Reach for what's real, don't settle for what's artificial.

With such an outlook, the truth becomes clear. That Episcopalian prayer is for every day, not merely for brief respites from daily drudgery. So I'm going to print it out and carry it with me wherever I go.

How about you?

So much thanks to all of you for your generosity in gifting the Pentecost Offering! This year, as of June 6th, our grand total was \$1,373.00. To remind you, 40% of this offering remains with our congregation to support local ministries that serve children and youth. This year, our chosen local agency that provides a drop-in center for high school students and a rapid rehousing for homeless youth is the NEPA Youth Shelter. We sent to the Shelter a donation of \$600 (40% of the offering \$549.20 plus M & J addition \$50.80), which should help them in the expenses of hiring security during their hours of operation.


