NEPACMS is thrilled to present its most ambitious program yet, pairing the sublime Brahms Second Sextet, a masterpiece exuding elegance and rich lyricism, with Tchaikovsky's Souvenir de Florence, a bright and vigorous composition for string sextet, reminiscent of his renowned ballets. Over several years, Tchaikovsky painstakingly sketched, worked on, and reworked Souvenir de Florence, and expressed that composing for a string sextet is "terribly difficult...it seems that rather than writing for six voices, I am, in essence, composing for the orchestra, and only then arranging it for six string instruments." Indeed, these magnificent string sextets will fill the venue with resonances like an orchestra!



The concert will feature John Vaida (left) and Ambroise Aubrun on violin, Amy Iwazumi (right) and Kristina Giles on viola, and Erin Ellis and Lisa Caravan on cello.



The concert is open to the public free of charge, with a free-will offering taken to help defray the costs of the event. Our Arts Series is supported by a grant from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, a Lackawanna County Community Arts and Culture Grant, and by individual contributions.

From the Pastor

January 2024



Happy New Year! On behalf of our Session, I thank you for an outstanding 2023.

It was a strong year for our church, and I'm grateful for all the leadership and commitment that empowers our church's ministry. Now that the New Year has arrived, here's a quick list of what's coming:

Adult Education on Wednesday evenings has resumed. For four weeks (January 3, 10, 17, and 24), our study group will discuss some early episodes of "**The Chosen**," a video series that is making waves. For those who don't know about the series, "The Chosen" offers a fresh take on the ministry of Jesus. The Lord is portrayed with wisdom, power, and a sense of humor. It is a provocative series – let's talk about it in Room 206 at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesdays.

On January 31 and February 6, we will welcome **Dr. Michael Azar**, associate professor of religious studies at the University of Scranton. A specialist on Israel, Dr. Azar will offer an historical introduction to the current troubles in the Holy Land. What is the background on the war that began last fall? What are the issues and the underlying causes?

Journey to Scotland – Our church is planning a **Presbyterian Heritage trip** to Scotland during September 5-14. An informational meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 16 at 7:00 p.m. All are welcome to gather in the Session Room (206) or to sign on by ZOOM from home. A ZOOM link will be sent soon to all who have signed up online for information through our weekly email.

If you haven't expressed your interest in the trip and would like to do so, send me an e-mail (pastor@fpccs.org) by Sunday, January 14. The conversation will be recorded and available later on YouTube upon request. The brochures are available at the church and reservations are open – but don't linger! There's a lot of interest in the trip and we must cap registrations at 24 people.

Per Capita Sunday – The Session has set **Sunday, January 14** as an emphasis on our Per Capita contributions to the Presbyterian Church (USA). Each Presbyterian congregation is asked to share in the administrative costs of "running" our denomination. These funds provide staffing, training, and communication for all the presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly offices throughout the nation.

It is our Session's hope that each of our church members will contribute \$42.00 in this special appeal as a contribution through our congregation that benefits the wider church. It is our custom to pay the full per capita amount to the denomination each year. We have made remarkable strides in gathering the funds to meet our obligation, and we invite you to help us. Remember, it's \$42.00 per member (and not per household). This is the Presbyterian Way: we work together, not on our own.

With that in mind, I look forward to working together with you in this New Year. May God bless you and your families as we begin 2024 together.


Presbyterian Women Bible Study January 16, 2024
