From the Pastor

Summer 2024



It was a quiet Wednesday on my schedule. The only appointment was a 10:15 a.m. Zoom meeting with a group of pastors. Admittedly, I was ten minutes early, which was a bit close to the margin. Arriving in my study, I hit the power button on the computer, then got a cup of coffee as the machine powered up. Then I typed my password, clicked the Zoom link, and waited some more.

And waited. Nothing happened.

From the adjoining office, Nancy said, "The internet isn't working," so I went into action. I clicked the link again to no avail. Tried to connect through another portal, and that didn't work. In a desperate move, I rebooted the power for the internet by hitting a top secret switch in our building. Still dead. All I could do was fume – then mutter - and then I tapped a text message to a colleague's cell phone: "Sorry, computer system is not connecting."

My soul began to gyrate. How am I going to do my work if the internet is down? Can we do ministry if we can't depend on technology?

Well, of course we can. Yet it's sobering how much we depend on wires and wireless. It's not only the computers that cannot talk with one another when the internet connections aren't working. It's that mammoth copy machine, too, which is configured as our wireless printer. Nothing can get printed. When our cell phones are inside the building, they also rely on the internet for making and receiving calls.

Fortunately, the phone system – now an antique at 25+ years old - still works. We've begun to talk about its replacement. That might be expensive. And that wired connection on dial-up phones still works fine. It will be a good idea to keep it as is for a while.

As it turns out, the service provider was down the street, purporting to upgrade the system, and neglecting to tell us that we'd be unable to reply to e-mails for a while. With a full briefcase of office work to finish, I decided to go home and work from there. When I phoned the office a few hours later, Nancy said, "Here's a funny thing: as soon as you drove off, the internet returned." And when I apologized later to the members of the Zoom meeting, the leader replied, "You didn't miss much. No decisions were made, not much to talk about." Hmm. Imagine that – an unnecessary meeting!

All of this is an affirmation of how good it is to unplug for a brief breather. As the Presbyterian sage Anne Lamott once quipped, "Almost everything will work again if you unplug it for a few minutes, including you."

Good words for the summer, my friends. And somehow, Christ's ministry continues.



Spiritual Formation and Questions for the Journey

Some time ago, I served in campus ministry with InterVarsity for about twelve years. Throughout, I mentored hundreds of students on multiple college campuses. Before and after that experience, I also served two "tours of duty" assisting with high school youth groups. Many young adults are starting to form their own independent thoughts at these stages of life, providing a special perspective on spiritual formation.

In my meetings with students, I would start by asking them how they were doing. Actually, I would ask them that question three different ways in hopes of understanding more deeply the state of their soul that day. How are you? But how are you doing? No, really, how are you doing?



After an hour of conversation, I would often leave them with one more question. Each time, I would preface it with the statement, "You don't have to answer this now. This is a question for the journey over the next few weeks." Here are a few of my takeaways from that experience, and some of the questions that followed:

We all need to show up for each other. First and foremost, spiritual formation is about becoming more like Jesus. And Jesus says, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I will be there." There are two different contexts joined by this statement. One is the agreement on community standards to live by and the other is gathering in prayer (see Matthew 18). Both cases anticipate a positive result, because Jesus has promised to show up as well. Are we spending sufficient time with one another joined in the Spirit of Christ to experience deep transformation?

We should be the same people every day of the week. A classic question we would ask students and alumni is this, "Where is the church on Monday?" Many people live their "church lives" on Sundays and maybe Wednesdays. But in truth, the Christian life is meant to be lived every day of the week. When God goes with us into new contexts, we bring that spirit of transformation with us, wherever we are. How might it change things at home and at work and in the community for Christ to go with us everywhere?

We can't answer college level questions with middle school answers. Every stage of life brings with it new questions. This is true of college students who need more thoughtful answers for their life questions than what they learned in youth group. It's also true as we approach middle age and become senior citizens, that we need experience and perspective beyond what was available in our younger years. *Are we leaning into all the wisdom available to us for the moment we are living now?*

Where one stands depends on where one sits. This is a maxim from the business world. It suggests that your position on an issue is conditioned by the role you play in the organization, or where (or even if) you sit at the Board table. The issues you touch personally are what matter to you most, defining your personal mission. I have long been an advocate for mental health, because so many of my folks I know have suffered through major diagnoses. Are we putting ourselves in places where we can see the world's hurt and be witnesses of God's healing?

As we move through summer in anticipation for fall, we are planning opportunities for people of all ages to grow together in Christ. We want to be a place of true spiritual formation. We will be sharing more ideas about books to read, habits to try, and eventually some events where we can support one another. We hope you'll join us!



The Nursery, located in room 208 on the sanctuary level of the building, is open Sunday mornings from 9:40—11:10 a.m. for children ages 3 and younger.


