From the Pastor

December 2024

"Some people come for the sermons, but I come for the music." If I've heard it once, I've heard it a dozen times. When December comes, I heartily agree.

This is the season for music. Every choral group is presenting its holiday concert. Every orchestra, band, or piano teacher offers a recital of favorite melodies. And why not? Christmas prompts a lot of tunes. Some are classic ("O Holy Night"), some are faithful conjectures ("The Little Drummer Boy"), many are religiously uncommitted ("White Christmas"), and others are ridiculous parodies ("Grandma Got Run Over by a Reindeer"). All of these have been generated by the season – to say nothing of the Big Event at the center of it all.

Naturally, our life together will be filled with songs through the next month. In worship, we celebrate an "abbreviated Advent," proclaiming our great human hopes without too quickly rushing to their fulfillment. That said, the Christmas carols will begin popping up by December 8. To those who protest, "But the stores have been playing 'Jingle Bells,' since Halloween," my retort is simply, "Yeah, and they are trying to sell you a lot of stuff." The carols that sing of Christ's birth offer a different soundtrack than the jingles of unchecked consumerism that miss the true reason for the season.

I'll preach on five Christmas carols this month. Not the ones in the hymnal, but the ones from the Gospel of Luke. It seems every time an angel appears in the Christmas story, somebody breaks into song. Sometimes it's the angel (Luke 1:13-17 and 1:28-33) or a choir of angels (Luke 2:14), but it could be Mary (Luke 1:46-55), her Uncle Zechariah (1:68-79), or old man Simeon (Luke 2:23 -32). Each carol is full of the Holy Spirit. Together, they proclaim the work of God and invite us to live in the Messiah's light.

To this, we also add a brief Adult Education series on Handel's Messiah and an invitation to sing along (see page 4). That's a fresh opportunity to immerse ourselves in a favorite old tune. We will also gladly welcome the Marywood guitar ensemble at our church for a free community concert on December 6 (also on page 4). My friend Dr. Diogo Carvalho will bring a dozen acoustic guitar students to dazzle us with their string work and lift our spirits as the world grows dark.

Listening to music is a spiritual practice. I hope you'll make time to open your heart to strong melodies, ponder rich harmonies, and tap your toes to the rhythms of God's creativity. Music is a gift of solace and grace. And it's good for us. As we pause beside each weary road, we listen for the angels – and the promise that they will give back the song that God has given us to sing.


Main Idea: Water is so essential, and its presence and absence so impactful, that both Scripture and contemporary events reflect its multidimensional effects on human life.



From the Generosity Team

Dr. Ann Michel of the Lewis Center for Church Leadership states: "Like prayer, scripture reading, and dedication to service, the practice of giving regularly and intentionally helps us grow in faith and mature spiritually. It serves as a continual reminder of God's claim on our lives. It requires us to put our own needs and wants into proper perspective, setting aside our own interests for the sake of God and others. Let us pledge to return to God a generous portion of the great bounty that our Lord, out of love, has shared with us.

December Volunteer Corner

One Sunday a few weeks ago I watched the choir members as they entered the choir loft prior to worship. 18 singers strong that particular day - 7 men and 11 women. 18 talented volunteer musicians offering their gift of music to all of us.

Other Sundays we have the pleasure of appreciating the talents of the bell choir, directed for the past 24 years (**yes, 24 YEARS**) by Volunteer Director Dick Cochrane. Currently there are 11 ringers, two rehearsal subs and one Sunday sub.

It is important to note that these musicians don't just pop in on Sundays to sing or ring. They rehearse weekly and share their music at funerals, at special services throughout the year, and recently led a sing-along on Worship through Service Sunday at The Pines. Some of them lend their skills to provide instrumental music on summer Sundays and on other special occasions. And of course, we recently had the pleasure of listening to all of our musicians at the "All Church Recital".

As we enter the seasons of Advent and Christmas, we are especially grateful for these talented folks and their dedication to the music program at FPC. What would this time of year be without the sounds of music?



Christian Education: Growing in Faith and Love

Bible Time: After Children's Time in the sanctuary, children (age 4 to grade 4) are invited to go to *The Bible Time Classroom* (room 108) to hear Bible stories in age appropriate terminology and take part in an activity related to the story. Children will return to the sanctuary after the sermon with a take-home packet to further enhance the story they

heard. December stories will include God's promise of peace, being surprised by grace, God's gift of love, rejoice and ponder (Jesus' birth), and Simeon & Anna rejoice.

We Worship Together series: A 30-minute program held after worship for children through grade 6. We Worship Together examines questions we have about church practices and traditions. Each family will receive a book to take home related to the topic

discussed. Have you ever wondered what exactly baptism is and why we do it? Our next program in the series will be held on **January 12** to learn about the sacrament of **baptism.**

We Believe: faith foundations for our pre-confirmation age youth. A mix of Bible 101, faith questions, and church basics to help prepare children in grade 6 and up for their confirmation journey, We Believe will be a combination of discussions, activities, and self-study. We will meet December 15 after worship (3rd Sunday of each month).


